

narthex for these items!!!


So, come on Salem, let's <u>CELEBRATE!!!</u> Let's come together and make Salem's 50th anniversary year one we will remember and cherish for years to come!

WORSHIP NOTES FROM PASTOR DICK



^{2nd} English Lutheran Church of Baltimore, Md. closed after a ministry of 176 years

When 2nd English Lutheran Church of Baltimore, Md. closed after a ministry of 176 years, the people of God there wanted to continue the legacy of their congregation by sharing specific items with congregations in the Delaware/Maryland Synod. Salem received from 2nd English Lutheran Church the following to help in our ministry of worship:

A Paschal Candle – is traditionally used during the time of celebrating a baptism, during the 40 days of Easter, and throughout the year as desired. This candlestick can be seen in Salem Church to the left of the pulpit.



Also gifted to Salem were copies of a <u>blue hymnal "With One Voice"</u>. This hymnal contains worship services and hymns which are not found in our new hymnal.

Third, the choir was gifted with the <u>choir robes</u> used at 2nd English Church.

2017-2018 school year got off to a great start. Our Before and After School care, Extended Day Preschool programs and three-day preschool classes are full. Attendance is high in the other preschool programs. 67 preschoolers graduated on May 14th 2017!

There have been many staff changes for the **2017-2018** school year roster. Several of our young ladies graduated colleges with education degrees and went on to be employed by public schools. We are happy to have our new dedicated employees being coached and mentored by skilled, knowledgeable senior staff.

Last year we improved the playground out back, and added new fencing. The sandbox has been completed and on warm days the children are enjoying the "beach" at Salem. The children will be able to enjoy lunch and snacks outside again soon. Our playground area will be a wonderful place for the children to enjoy in the summer.

This January we updated SLCC restrooms, and accessible height toilets were added in the church. SLCC put gutter guards on the school and church.

Some of our classes went on their first field trips of the year to places like the Fire Museum of Baltimore, Maze Quest and local farms. Our school-age children had the pleasure of visiting Forest Hill Lanes on an HCPS scheduled closing.

January 29, 2017

To get the year off to a good start, we shared a **Mystery Dish Brunch**. Participants prepared 23 new and interesting recipes, including appetizers, snacks, breads, soups, main dishes and desserts to include in our cookbook! Proceeds from the dinner and cookbook sales benefited **Welcome One Homeless Shelter** (\$400 and counting)!





January 17, 2017

Shelter for Homeless at Harford County Churches

"Helping Harford Country's Homeless" set up a network of area churches as shelters during the winter. Fourteen churches hosted the homeless overnight. Each church housed a maximum number of people of 15-20 from 5 PM to 8 AM. Since Salem had no facilities for overnight, we joined other churches to help needy people at food banks at Ayers Chapel in Norrisville and at Lord of Life Lutheran in Edgewood. New Hope Methodist in Edgewood collects and provides people with socks, hats, gloves, and jeans (sizes 30-34, some 36).

Mason-Dixon Community Services

<u>February 1</u>, "Souper " Bowl Sunday Drive - We were well on our way to exceed our \$1,179.17 in giving in 2016! We donated 240 items of soup and goodies to <u>Mason/Dixon</u> for their work with the needy from our "Souper" Bowl Sunday drive.

March 6-10 Book Fair held for our SLCC kids at Salem!

In April we donated and delivered 70 food items and 41 toiletries.

<u>In May</u>, our congregation delivered 174 food items and 54 toiletries Last Summer Salem members responded to the needs of the Mason-Dixon Community services clients in a big way.

Back to School, As of August 27th, we were able to donate 111 school items and backpacks. By October we were able to donate 290 school items, 560 food items, and 54 toiletries! Items were delivered to Mason-Dixon every two weeks.

Beginning in November we brought items for Thanksgiving, along with turkeys from SLCC, for four families in our Mason -Dixon community.


November 12 - Gather Together Sunday - family and friends brought a dish or dessert for fun and fellowship.
