Epiphany and the season after Epiphany is a continuation of the joy of Christmas. I have a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education from Towson University. While in college I actually worked here at SLCC as a teacher for four years. After college, I taught 4th grade in Baltimore County Public Schools and then worked with children aged 3-10 in a preschool and childcare center in York County, PA. I have a passion for working with and teaching children. I am so happy to be back at Salem and to be a part of such a caring and supportive environment.

Preschool registration for the 2019-2020 school year has started at SLCC. We currently have openings in the 2 day AM and PM three-year-old classes, the 3 day PM four-year-old class, and the 5 day AM four-year-old class. There is a \$60 nonrefundable registration fee that is usually required when registering. However, please remember that church members do not need to pay this registration fee. We also have an upcoming Two and You class for 2-year-old children accompanied by an adult. The program begins January 31st and continues for 10 weeks until Thursday, April 4th. The class will meet on Thursdays from 9:30-10:45. The kids will participate in a variety of activities that encourage the development of language, large and fine motor skills, basic art skills, math concepts and socialization while learning colors and shapes. Finally, we are very thankful that Pastor Betty Lou has become a part of our program. She spends her Wednesdays and Thursdays teaching our preschool children. I have had many teachers, parents, and children come to tell me how wonderful Pastor Betty Lou's lessons are. We look forward to working with her this year!

We wish him Godspeed, as he attempts once again to retire!












WE closed 2018, giving gifts to four Mason – Dixon area families, singing a cantata, and celebrating the nativity with our homegrown angels and shepherds.
