<u>March</u> and <u>April</u> are "comin' round the corner." That is, I really hope this means we are turning the weather corner. In lieu of the reoccurring color of white I, for one, am looking for some green and not just St. Patrick's Day. On February 2nd **Punxsutawney Phil** predicted an Early Spring! What we've experienced has been teaser winter storms that remind us we are not there yet.

On March 3rd the church season transitions from Christmas/Epiphany to Lent in preparation for Easter. This Sunday is worshiped as the Transformation of Our Lord. We have been given revealing glimpses of God through the eyes and experiences of Jesus. In the lenten darkness a light continues to shine and with each day of the sun drawing closer to the Earth the light becomes brighter and warms our souls. BUT, we must enter into Lent. We do so with minds that set aside time for prayer, mindfully reflect on our lives and actions, past and present, and with repentant hearts we long for the blessed promise of forgiveness and life found only through Jesus and the Cross. These are times we find difficult and would rather just skip over Lent altogether. However, to skip over this time of lent and the practices of prayer, reflection and repentance could we receive and be filled with the joy and awe pouring from Jesus and a cross? Could we embrace the holiness, the life-giving mercy and gracious love of Jesus we are offered and invited to live in today through our Lord's life, death and resurrection? Lent begins **March 6** with the Community **Ash Wednesday** Soup Supper at **6:00pm** and Worship with the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion at **7:00pm**. This year Salem Lutheran is the host for the community.

Community Mid-Week, Soup Supper and Worship begins **March 13** and will meet each Wednesday during Lent at Bethel Presbyterian Church. Supper begins at 6:00pm and the service follows at 7:30pm.

For three weeks in Lent children in 1st grade and older are meeting for First Communion instruction. The children will receive their First Communion along with their families on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday.

Worship Notes from Pastor Dick:

Lent – a time for rejoicing

That's correct; Lent is a time to rejoice. When the Sundays in Lent were known by Latin names, the fourth Sunday in Lent was called "Laetare" – REJOICE!

But isn't Lent a time for discipline, confession, reproach? These things aren't confined to the time of Lent, but are very much with all year long. We also are used to being told to "give up" something. But because Lent should be a time of REJOICING, let's take the time to be joyful. Why? Because of the fantastic, incomprehensive love of God for all people is to motivate and inspire us to a life of faith and trust in God.

Imagine, every morning – not only during Lent but for the rest of your life – you can wake up and know that you are loved, respected, having dignity and worth – because God is faithful, abounding in steadfast love always. 
