# Pastor's Ponderings

This last week in September and the tiptoeing into October is looking like a swarm of bees buzzing in and out of the church



building. I say bees, but then that can conjure up a few stinging memories from a couple weeks ago. I heard someone, used the term, "fleas," to refer to YOU as running up and down, and all along the pews sorting clothes, pricing items, and setting up specialty booths, like the Christmas section, all in preparation for this Saturday's Craft Fair and Flea Market. During this morning's devotion time I read in The Message version of the bible from Zechariah 8:20-23,


















# Appreciation for our Donation

We are so excited for our school year to begin at SLCC! Our preschool and daycare classes have been busy learning school routines and getting acquainted with each other. Each month every preschool and daycare class focuses on 3-4 letters to learn. The 3's daycare class

- After the summer months off, your Parish Council members reconvened on September 14th to discuss church business once again.
- COVID-19 still remains with us and the Council discussed whether any changes to the in person service were needed. A motion was passed to keep the service as it is for now – communion offered without gathering around the altar, hymns and readings printed in the bulletin, and an online service emailed weekly for those who can't attend in person.
- COVID-19 concerns for the Craft Fair were also addressed. Signs will be posted requesting masks be worn by all who enter the Rainbow Room or the church that day.
- Council also approved a Girl Scout service project. A local troop is constructing a "Blessing Box" which will be installed on church property and stocked with items for needy members of the community. More information to come as this worthy project continues.
